Wow, it's hot out there, I hope everyone is keeping cool. I wanted to share a few updates from Saanich Council and get your help on a few issues. If you don't have a chance to read through the whole update, please take a minute to sign the national petition for free prescription contraception!

While we have fewer Council meetings in August, we still managed to get a lot done, and notably approving some much-needed housing. We recently approved nine townhouses on Freeman Ave. just off

Shelbourne St. And just this week, Council also <u>unanimously approved</u> a 58-unit project on Tyndall Ave.

Music in the Park season is winding down. I was happy to volunteer to help with parking at this week's concert in Rutledge Park.




These leaflets are being distributed to communities across Canada. For example, the City of Strathmore, Alberta just <u>adopted a bylaw</u> concerning these leaflets, and news stories report <u>recent incidents</u> in Vernon.

I have drafted a <u>report to Council on Graphic Leaflets</u>, in response to concerns raised by residents, and will be presenting it at our August 21st meeting. I am looking forward to presenting my first report to Council.

Project Updates

Reproductive Justice



Last month, friends at <u>Project EmpowHer</u> launched a national petition for free prescription contraception, and the <u>AccessBC Campaign</u> is working hard to support these efforts.

I just checked and the petition is currently at 4,965 signatures! A big thank you to everyone who has already signed. To those who haven't done so, the deadline is August 26th at 8:05 PST!

It takes less than a minute to sign and will this will go a long way to helping our efforts to make prescription contraception universally available at no cost across the country!

Little Free Libraries



Cutting the ribbon on the 700th little free library in the region on July 30th!

On July 30th, neighbours gathered on Wilson St. in Vic West to cut the ribbon on the 700th little free library in the region. It was a fantastic

event! I'm grateful to Kolby Gasko and his family for helping host the event and for setting up this delightful little free library dedicated to children's books!

The event was widely covered by local media, and you can read up more in the <u>Victoria News, Victoria Now, CHEK News, Victoria Buzz, and Capital Daily.</u>

Now, it took us a few weeks to set up the ribbon cutting and people in the region love LFLs, so as of today, I'm excited to say that there are over 730 LFLs in the CRD. You can find all of the regions 700+ LFLs mapped out on the <u>Greater Victoria Placemaking Network's website</u>. A friend just sent me a pile of previously unmapped LFLs on Salt Spring, so I think this number is going to climb rapidly.

Falaise Crescent Road Mural Repaint!



This coming Sunday, August 20th, I'll be working with the good people of the Falaise Community Association, along with community volunteers and folks from the Greater Victoria Placemaking Network to touch up and expand the <u>road mural on Falaise Crescent</u>.

We could use a few more volunteers. So if you are looking for something to do that gives back to the community this coming weekend, head over to Falaise Crescent between 9 am and early afternoon on August 20th, to help out. Wear work cloths. There will be refreshments and snacks.
