Saanich Updates




Saanich Council has been hard at work on a number of exciting policies. I'm particularly happy to be reviewing the update of the <u>Active Transportation Plan</u> at this Monday's meeting, among other important agenda items.

Speed limits will be dropping around Saanich. Council recently adopted a motion that will drop speed limits on a number of roads around the District (see map below). I am also very excited to see this policy implemented.

It is part of a broader suite of road safety measures, that include a Road Safety Action Plan, which should reach Council this fall! You can read more about the speed reduction policy here and here.

We also <u>took a shot</u>, albeit a long one, in asking for some of the provinces' surplus money to invest in housing and active transportation infrastructure in the District. Fingers crossed!

This past week, I chaired the last meeting of the Active Transportation Advisory Committee (ATAC). Moving forward I will be chairing the newly formed Transportation Advisory Committee (TAC). A huge thank you to all of the amazing neighbours who volunteered their time and insight on ATAC.

Crisis Pregnancy Centres: Website

The <u>Abortion Rights Coalition of Canada</u> (ARCC) and the <u>BC</u> <u>Humanist Association</u> (BCHA) recently released a study exploring crisis pregnancy centres, and I am proud to have been one of the coauthors of <u>the report</u>.

Crisis pregnancy centres (CPCs) are 'fake clinics' that rely on motivated counselling and employ a host of deceptive tactics as a means of dissuading people experiencing unplanned pregnancies from choosing abortions.

To illustrate some of the issues we uncovered, BCHA Acting Executive Director Olivia Jensen and I recently released a <u>walkthrough video</u>, where we explore a CPC website and identify problematic features. It's great as a supplement to the report or for those who TLDR'd the report.

We will be releasing additional CPC website walkthroughs in the months to come!

Little Free Libraries



For the past while, I have been delivering <u>Moose Hide Campaign</u> cards and pins to little free libraries around the region. I've delivered around 2,800 pins and had numerous conversations about how we can end gender-based violence.
